the attention of the public at large.

As time was the essence of the contract and Eastern Clackamas wanted to do its full share, it was decided to raise the money first, and scrap it out afterwards, if there was any scrap coming, for the Red Cross cause was too important a one to be held up by sectional differences.

In Mr. McBain's letter, he states, "Miss Mary Cronin of Portland, a Red Cross nurse was sent to Estacada at the request of Mgr. Sullivan. But this claim is refuted by Miss Cronin herself, who was in Estacada again a day or so ago.

The letter furthermore states, "campaign literature was also sent from the county headquarters to Postmaster Heylman," which, while probably received by Mr. Heylman, apparently did not get into the hands of the local Red Cross enthusiasts.

Mr. Devore, who it also alleges was asked about the campaign here, came before the local committee on the 23rd and asked if the drive then underway, could not be handled under the direction of the county organization, but as it seemed like a matter of small importance, who handled the campaign, the work went right along and the money came pouring in.

Clackamas County is credited with over \$14,000, raised for the Red Cross and in this amount is the sum of \$1,081.16 raised by the Estacada community, excepting the Viola district, which remitted directly to Oregon City.

Had Mgr. Sullivan of the county committee, carefully followed up his instructions sent to the school clerks in this district, he would have discovered that nothing was being done, but as he did not do so, the local people got busy for themselves and consummated a strenuous four days drive.
