Father And Son Drown In Clackamas

Mr. Livingstone was a widow-
er, being survived by an only
daughter, Mrs. Hazel Beers of
Gresham; a sister, Mrs. Amanda
Young of Portland and seven sis-
ters residing in the east.

Funeral services were held
Tuesday afternoon, at the Esta-
cada Christian Church, Mr. Wal-
ter Givens officiating. Interment
followed in Lone Oak Cemetery.

This sad accident is but one of
many that have occurred in the
Clackamas River near here and
should be another warning to all
people, whether swimmers or not,
to keep out of that stream,
which, with its strong currents,
treacherous eddies and whirl-
pools, gives little chance for its
victim to regain the slippery and
rocky banks.

For some unknown reason, the
military tournament, which the
News had been requested to ad-
vertise for last Saturday after-
noon in Estacada, was called off
by its sponsors, the soldiers of
Company D. This action was a
disappointment to many people
who had come to town to see the
