John Osborn, Estacada's pioneer berry grower, reports that while the present crop of small fruits is below average and subject to harm from the present drought, that all berries are bringing top prices in the eastern Oregon market. The demand there is so great that the dealers are even sending their checks in advance to the growers, to assure receiving the fruits, which this year have been paid for f. o. b. Estacada at a price of \$2. per case for blackcaps, \$1.50 for raspberries and \$1.25 for loganberries.
