August 9, 1917.

Estacada, Ore.,  
Gentlemen:

You asked me recently how I  
liked my Chevrolet "490" car.

If I could not replace the car,  
I would not sell it for twice what  
it cost me.

The car was purchased by me  
from E. S. Peters Co., Tuscan,  
Arizona, June 2nd, 1917. Strictly  
stock car. I drove it two  
weeks before starting to Oregon,  
so was a comparatively green  
driver. My wife and I loaded  
the car to the guards and started  
across the Mojave desert which  
they would not let us travel dur-  
ing the day on account of heat.  
Then thru Grand Canyon and  
over grades as high as 35%.

The entire distance covered  
was about 2300 miles and the time  
on the road was a little less than  
ten days. Average mileage a day  
was over 230. I kept accurate  
record of gasoline and the aver-  
age mileage on gasoline was  
about 22 miles. I did not spend  
one cent for repairs and the car  
is running as good as ever.

So far as I now know, the  
Chevrolet will always be my
