### Berry Pickers Sight Aeroplane

Great excitement reigned in the camp of huckleberry pickers at the foot of Squaw Mountain last Saturday evening, when all in the party, consisting of the Misses Roberta and Elizabeth Reid and Wilma Duncan of Garfield, Miss Echo Wade of Curriusville and Charles Duncan of Garfield, for three minutes witnessed the flight of an aeroplane along the top of the ridge beyond the mountain.

The ranger in charge of the Squaw Mountain Lookout Station did not see it, but reports having had a number of reports from other campers of the presence several times of the machine in that vicinity within the past two weeks.

There is no doubt of the aeroplane having been seen as all witnesses agree in its description but state that despite its nearness of less than two miles, no sound of the engine could be distinguished.
