The judging was ably handled by Professors Brown and Wing of the O. A. C. and a partial list of the awards will be shown in these columns next week, including Thursday's Baby Show.

President Stephens of the Fair Board opened Wednesday's program with an address of welcome, followed by the introduction of Sen. C. W. Fulton of Portland, who stimulated the patriotism of all by his rousing appeal to all true Americans.
