C., he modestly accounts for his new title of Lieutenant of the Machine Gun Company of the 162nd U. S. Infantry, having been one of fourteen men, of a class of twelve hundred, to successfully pass the required examination.

The letter contained an interesting description of the army life and camp activities, explaining the methods pursued in combating the poisonous gases now used in modern warfare.

Sylvester advises the importation of Southern negro labor into the Oregon fields, for he says "they will work for six bits a day."

In closing, he wished to be remembered to all friends at home and said it was probable that by the time the letter arrived, he would be crossing the "big creek" enroute to France.
