Serial No. 04567 made August 16, 1915, for the E 1-2 of SW 1-4 and Lots 3 and 4 of Section 18, Township 5 South, Range 4 East, Willamette, Meridian, and as grounds for his contest he alleges that the said George W. Townsend has wholly abandoned said tract for more than six months last past; that no improvements nor cultivation has been made on said land except a small cabin; that entryman's absence from said land was not due to his employment in military service rendered in connection with operations in Mexico, or along the borders thereof, nor in the European war, or in mobilization camp elsewhere, in the military or naval organizations of the United States or National Guard of any of the several states, or in any auxiliary organization connected with, or in co-operation with any military operation whatsoever;

You are, therefore, further notified that the said allegations will be taken as confessed, and your said entry will be cancelled without further right to be heard, either before this office or on appeal, if you fail to file in this office within twenty days after the FOURTH publication of this notice, as shown below, your answer under oath, specifically responding to these allegations of contest, together with due proof that you have served a copy of your answer on the said contestant either in person or by registered mail.
