The nation wide campaign to enroll 15,000,000 people in the Red Cross is now well underway, with Oregon's quota 240,000 members. The slogan of the campaign is "Join the Red Cross; all you need—a dollar and a heart."

The News has been asked by a leading farmer of this community to start a campaign urging the installation of public scales in Estacada.

On investigating, we find that nearly every city or town of any consequence has a public scales, in some instances being operated by the city, with a small charge made for weighing.

Today Estacada is without such a convenience and the few private scales are so located as to be nearly inaccessible for public weighing.

Such scales probably would not exceed an expense of over \$200, and should pay for themselves within a few years from the receipts.

"Bibles For Soldiers" is the slogan of another important campaign now receiving state wide attention, with Oregon scheduled to raise \$15,000. This campaign is being backed by the majority of religious organizations of the state, with December 9th to 17th being the time allowed for the drive. The value of putting the Scriptures into the hands of all soldiers and sailors, as an instrument in aiding the morale, is too evident to need further emphasis.

The plea of the P. R. L. & P. Co. now being made to the Public Service Commission, asking to be allowed to increase its rate from 5c to 6c should receive the consent of that body and the sup-

port of every citizen of the state. With the company now paying wages to all employees in keeping with the increased cost of living, it should be entitled to increase its rates in proportion.
