Miss Rosalie Allen of Logan was the guest Friday of Miss Nettie Woodle of Upper Eagle Creek.

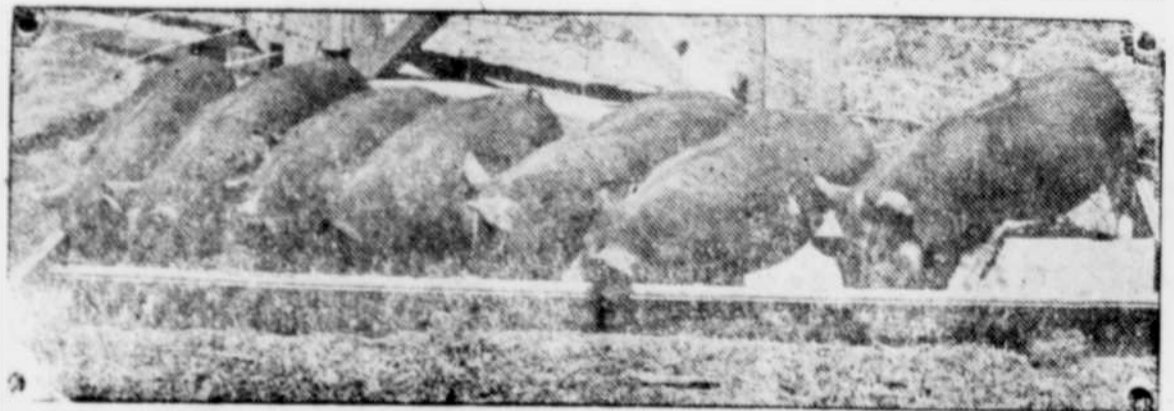
E. E. Elliott and wife of Portland called on a number of Eagle Creek friends Saturday.
