### Legal Opinion Wanted

A correspondent in the Oregonian, wants to know whether the blackberries growing on the public road belong to the public or not. He would like a legal opinion for the sake of arriving at the truth, and for the purpose of keeping someone from running into a legal snag. While not a lawyer, the writer ventures the opinion that common, undisputed practice sanctions the public picking the fruit. In England where property rights are rigidly protected, the public has always without dispute picked the berries overhanging hedges along the roadside. No objection is made if the berries on the field side of the hedge are picked, although if entrance to the field is forbidden anyone picking from the inside without permission, would be subject to arrest for trespass.
