Collier did not arrive, so after the singing by a quartette composed of Misses Mary Ely, Doris Finch, Irene Saling and Nora Smith, "On the Road to Home Sweet Home," the chairman made a ringing appeal for subscriptions. The two boy scouts, Victor Adix and Theodore Howe were kept busy distributing blanks among the audience and bringing them

when filled out to the tellers, Mrs. E. W. Bartlett and A. E. Sparks. Over three thousand dollars were subscribed for that evening, but as others had already done so before coming out, the day's returns were very satisfactory.

An impressive feature before the taking of subscriptions, was the singing of the national anthem by the whole assemblage, with the two scouts standing at salute, one at each end of the rostrum. The proceedings closed with the singing of America.
