## FOR HUMAN SALVAGE

This week a drive is being made for funds to carry on the work of the Salvation Army. The future historian of the nineteenth and twentieth centuries, will find a most interesting theme in its rise and development from a London slum to its present world wide and influential status. We can remember when it first began to get into the lime light in England, and the ridicule it then encountered, an experience repeated over here. But it has won its way through sheer proving of its value and merit. Its position in philanthropic endeavor is unique. No other organization exactly competes with it, unless it be in a small way, its own offspring the Volunteers of America. Only recently in Portland, a man and his wife met a girl on the street in an apparently drunken condition. They acted the Good Samaritans towards her and took her home. Then they telephoned different organizations but none would receive her as she was intoxicated. The police station could not unless as a prisoner held for trial. Finally the Salvation Army was appealed to, which took her in and ministered to her both in body and soul.

But what has proved the climax in winning the public approval and support has been its war work in ministering to the comfort of the soldiers. In one of the humorous journals lately, was a picture of two doughboys enjoying fresh doughnuts on the firing line, supplied by the Salvation lassies. One said to the other, "Do you remember, Bill, how we used to jeer at the Salvation Army and break up its meetings?" The other replied soulfully, "I do, but NEVER again."

Serving doughnuts, pies and hot coffee to the boys at the front, may not be so very much in itself, but it was as the culmination of a long list of good deeds it became so effective.

There is no doubt that every dollar given to it, is made to do double duty in the relief of distress and the salvaging of human derelicts.
