Closed Season for Elk

"There is to be no shooting of elk in Oregon during the year 1919." Such was the declaration made by State Game Warden Carl D. Shoemaker, who has received a number of inquiries as to the date of the opening of the season for hunting elk. In order that the misunderstanding may be corrected, the Game Warden explained that the 1909 law protected elk until Aug. 1, 1919, but this law was repealed by the 1913 Legislature and perpetual protection was provided for this noble animal. "There will be no open season on elk in this state at any time unless the Legislature fixes one at some future session. We only have a few elk in the state and an open season would kill practically all of these off," said Mr. Shoemaker.

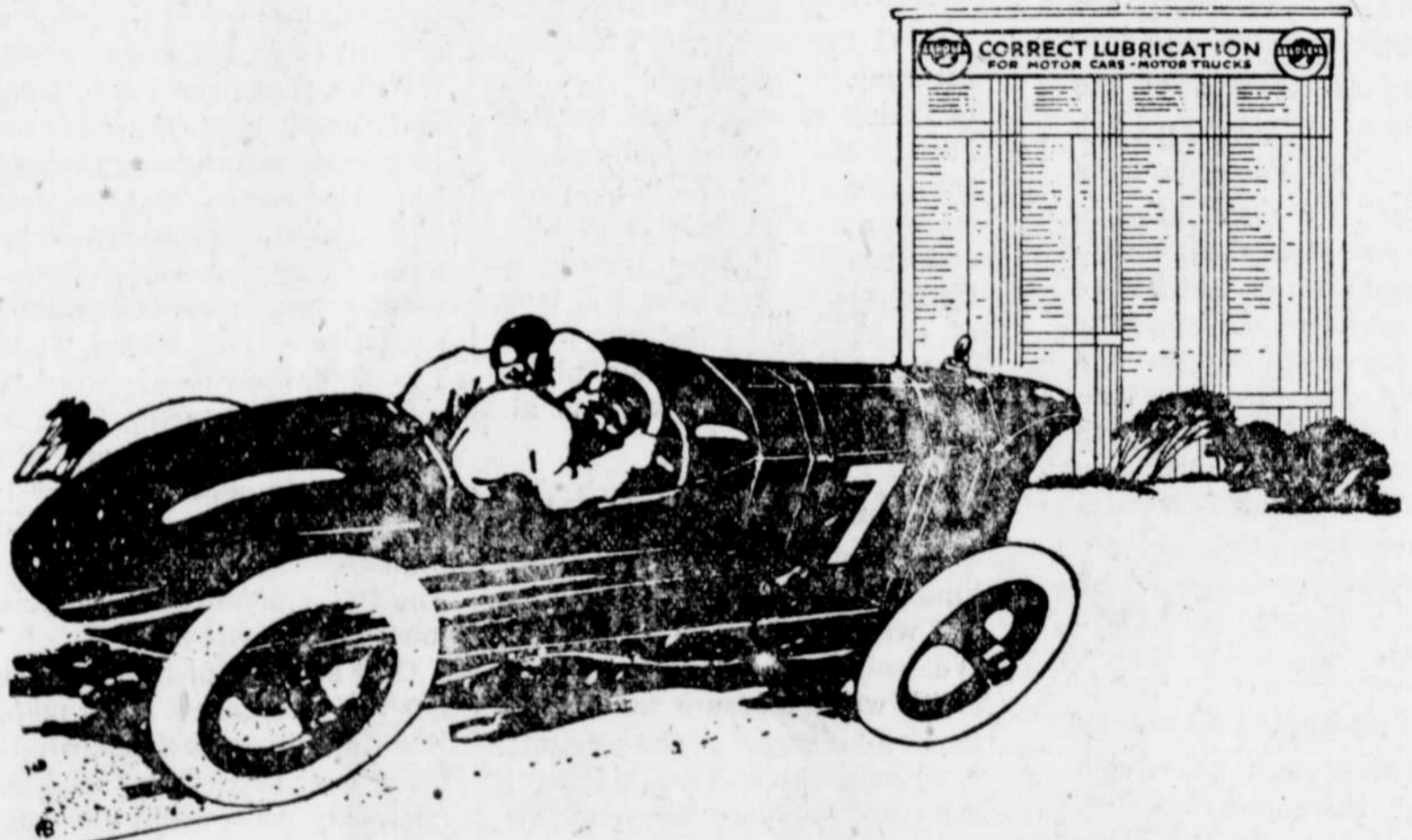
