Mrs. Ed. Douglass went to Aurora, Ore., Monday where she visited her mother and other members of the family for two or three days.


Mrs. J. W. Reed and her sister, Miss Oakley, returned Sunday from their California visit. where they went through the famous Yosemite valley.
