To Estacada Telephone Subscribers

At recent meetings of the Oregon local Telephone Association with the Public Service Commission the rate question was discussed. This discussion elicited the fact that the home company was giving switching rates for on an average of one half less than most companies and in some cases less than one fourth. The increased cost of material, labor and war tax compels the company to increase the rate to 50 cents per month. This is also to meet deterioration and installation of new equipment soon. The Public Service Commission has gone on record stating that each and every public service utility should earn a net profit of 8%. This the Estacada Telephone Co. has not paid even with rigid economy. Even the increased rate will not net an 8% dividend. Beginning September 1st, 1919, the new rate will be effective, and as soon as possible a continuous night and day service will be established with the following restrictions: viz. all local calls between the hours of 9 p. m. and 7 a. m. will be ten cents. All long distance calls same as regular long distance day

calls. All calls for physician or medical calls, calls reporting robberies, fires or distress calls free.

Charges for installation and changes as authorized by Public Service Commission may be seen at the telephone office.
