**The County Fair**

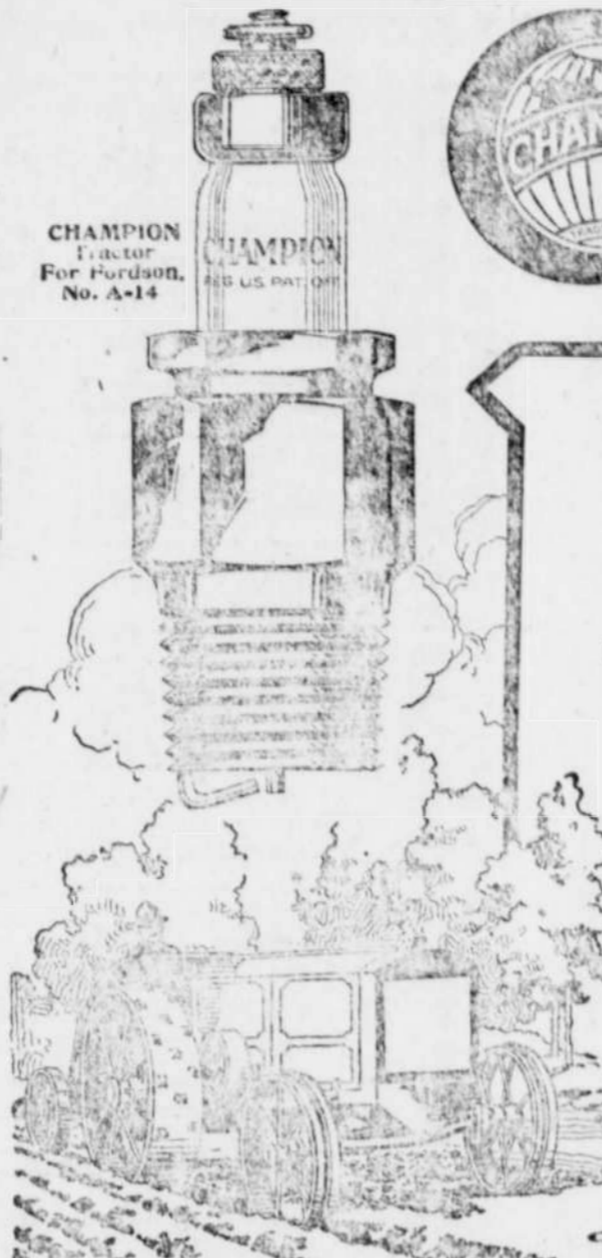
The thirteenth annual Clacka-
