BACTERIA DESCRIBED

Bacteria and one celled animal parasites are man's invisible foes and are to be found anywhere that they find a favorable environment as dirty places, stagnant water, decayed debris, etc. Louis Posteur, a noted bacteriologist, said, "It is within the power of man to cause all parasites disease (disease mostly caused by bacteria) to disappear from the world."

The way to do this is by means of proper sanitation. Every man, woman and child in the world should do his bit in cleaning up all places that are favorable for the growth of their enemies. Most towns and cities are practicing sanitation, but Estacada is not. Is is estimated that sanitary precautions would save 3,000,000 lives yearly in Europe and America. Surely Estacada can and will do her bit.

Tuberculosis, typhoid fever, diptheria, pneumonia, blood poisoning, diarhoea and a score of other diseases ought not to exist. A good deal more, than half of the present misery of this world might be prevented and this earth made cleaner and better by the co-operation of everybody in cleaning up everything and place that might have a disease germ.

Fire will kill disease germs. Then burn all debris and useless trash. Places where fire cannot be used may be disinfected with carbolic acid, formalin or formaldehyde, lysol or bichloride of mercury. The sun will do his share in killing disease germs if the places are cleaned of rubbish and left exposed so his sunbeams will reach all parts.

Knowing what the inhabitants of this swamp are, we think that it is proper to drain it, for these germs may be disease germs, and if they are it is a good place for disease

germs to multiply.

This place may be easily drained if the street was graded and the water drained from both sides into the gutters and emptied into the sewer at the corner near Lichthorn's store. Even though it be necessary to use tiling it would not cost the city much and it would greatly improve the appearance of Estacada.
