Public School Millage Tax

While pressing the needs of the higher educational institutions, the News is not unmindful of another imperative need that of the public school teachers.

This Bill Has Merit

Supporters of the legislative bill to be before the voters at the state election, May 21st, providing for the levying of one sixth of one mill for the purpose of erecting and equipping an industrial and employment institution in Oregon for the blind, are finding that the bill is meeting with general favor throughout the state, because of its practicability.

If this bill is approved it will provide the means whereby the blind of Oregon may drop their dependance on charity. Provision is made in the bill for the levying of one twenty-fifth of a mill in 1921 and each year thereafter for maintaining the institution, which will at all times be operated under the direction of the state Board of Control.
