#### Public School Millage Tax

While pressing the needs of the higher educational institutions, the News is not unmindful of another imperative need that of the public school teachers. Unless these are better paid there will be not only an alarming shortage of teachers, but those who remain in the profession will be of the poorest quality. An opponent of the measure in writing to one of the Portland papers, claimed that teachers were well paid for the number of school hours, but a capable teacher puts in preparation and study as many hours out of school if not more, than those in school.

Then during the vacation attendance at some summer school is generally compulsory if efficiency is to be maintained. Good teachers cannot be had in the long run, unless good salaries are paid, as a starved teacher has no life in him, and soon degenerates into a mere automaton, incapable of imparting either knowledge or enthusiasm to his pupils.

## This Bill Has Merit

Supporters of the legislative bill to be before the voters at the state election, May 21st. providing for the levying of one sixth of one mill for the purpose of erecting and equiping an industrial and employment institution in Oregon for the blind, are finding that the bill is meeting with general favor throughout the state, because of its practicability.

If this bill is approved it will provide the means whereby the blind of Oregon may drop their dependance on charity. Provision is made in the bill for the levying of one twenty-fifth of a mill in 1921 and each year thereafter for maintaining the institution, which will at all times be operated under the direction of the state Board of Control.
