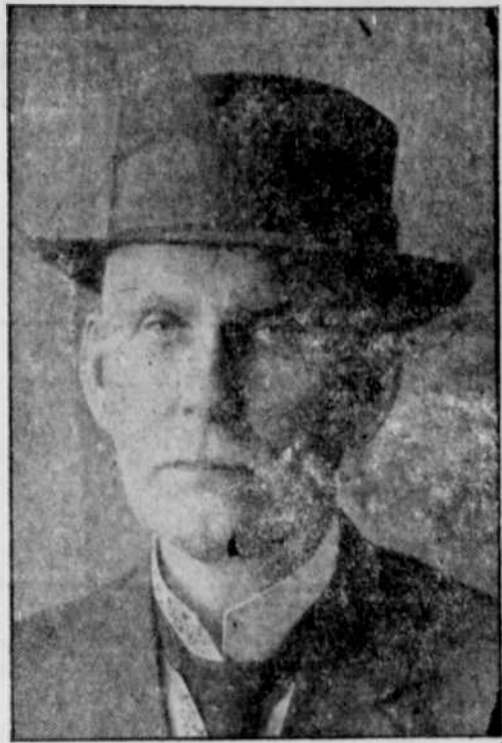

Oregon Man Leader in Great Religious Program



WILLIAM HIRAM FOULKES.

On the "general staff" of perhaps the greatest alliance of American Protestant Churches in history—the Interchurch World Movement—is a former pastor of Presbyterian Churches in the Middle and Far West: William Hiram Foulkes of New York City.

Vice chairman of the Interchurch executive committee and associate general secretary in its cabinet, Mr. Foulkes still finds time to direct the \$46,000,000 New Era Movement of the Presbyterian Church, which is that denomination's part in the Interchurch program for Protestant cooperation in world-wide missionary advance.

Born in Quincy, Mich., Mr. Foulkes preached in Elmira, Ill., Clinton, Ia., and Portland, Ore., before he came out of the West to become pastor of Rutgers Church, New York City. His nation-wide campaign for aged clergymen, as general secretary for ministerial relief and sustentation of the Presbyterian Church, made known his ability as an orator. In 1910 he was sent to Edinburgh as a delegate to the World's Missionary Conference. He is secretary of the executive committee of the Presbyterian National Service Commission.
