most appetizing breakfast.

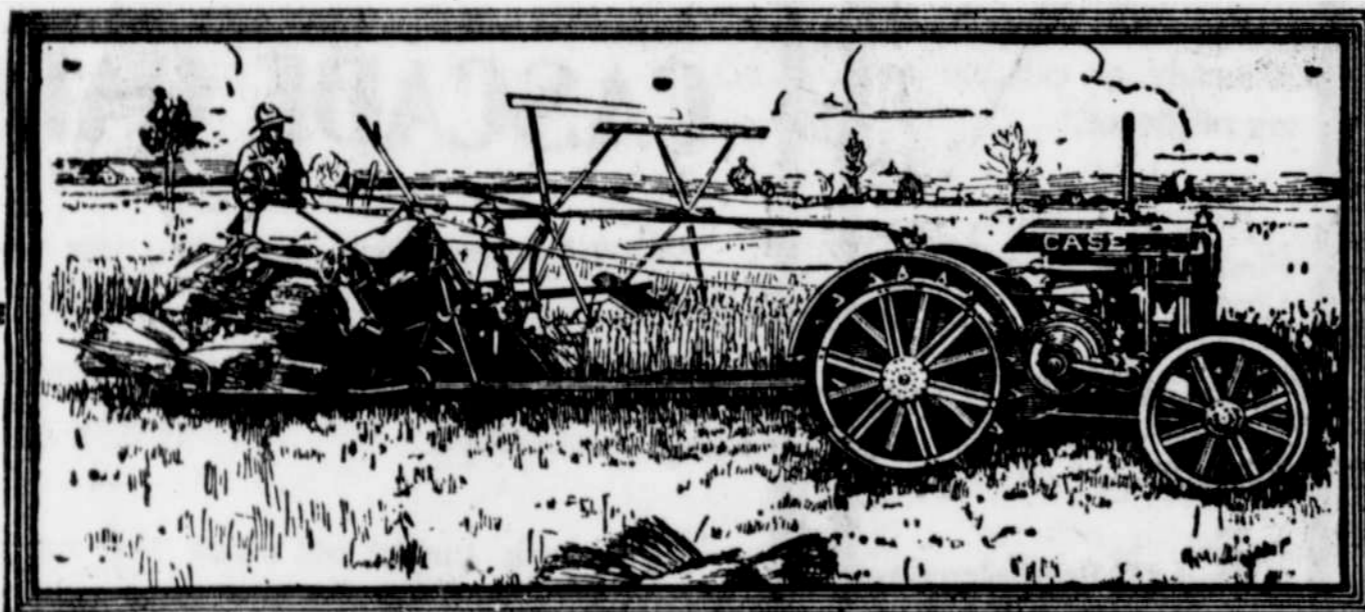
