in the tank on a previous visit when it was in operation. The effect is very realistic, regular surt and waves are generated, the latter possessing considerable force and an undertow. As the water in the tank at its farther end is ten feet deep, high diving and other stunts are indulged in by those who are expert at these performances.

At low tide the sea runs out a long distance leaving on the bay side an expanse of mud and weed which is thickly sown with clams and crabs. Numerous parties go out to return heavily laden with the spoil. In the woods and along the sand dunes, there is a profusion of salal and huckleberry shrubs, the latter this year being loaded with fruit.

Altogether it is, in the judgment of the writer, the best of the Tillamook beaches, the only drawback being the necessity of ferrying across the bay, but this will soon be obviated as the auto road from Tillamook to Bayocean is almost completed the county having appropriated \$25,000 to finish the work. When this is done, numbers of motorists will make the trip in their own cars. A new lease of life and a bright future ought to be in store for the place.
