### OBITUARY

Henry Martin Looney was born in Virginia, August 20, 1837, and came to Oregon 40 years ago, settling in Currinsville, where he lived until a few months ago. He was a civil war veteran having served in the Union army. He died at the home of his son R. A. Looney, at Salem, January 20th, aged 83 years, 5 months. The body was shipped to Currinsville, last Thursday to the home of his granddaughter, Mrs. J. H. Looney. The funeral services were held in the M. E. Church at 2 o'clock, Friday afternoon, with interment in Lone Oak cemetery. Besides his son, R. A. Looney, he leaves eight grandchildren and six great grandchildren, also one brother and three sisters who live in Virginia.
