This is expected to care for the power needs for many years to come.

In order to show the location of this new project and give an idea of what it is to consist there has been prepared a sketch of that part of the Clackamas river Mr. and Mrs. Tom Morton watershed in which the plant is

> The power to be obtained from development will be approximately 30,000 horsepower. The head under which the plant will operate is to be about 860 feet. This means that each cubic foot of water passing through the conduit will, when applied to the generating unit, produce about 70 horsepower.

At first the unregulated waters of the Ook Grove branch will be used. Later the storage dam at Timothy Meadows will be built and used to regulate the flow of the water as it comes to Intake. This regulation of water flow will serve to increase the summer time ontput of the plant, at the same time in no wise diminishing the winter output, thus insuring a constant output the year around. The next part of the development will consist in the building of a three-mile tunnel under the mountain, which lies between the Oak Grove branch and the upper branch of the Clackamas. and installing a low division dam at Big Bottoms. 




