**THOUGHTS ON LIFE**

The universe in spite of its immensity is circumscribed and limited. It is not self-existent or self-sustaining, for its life is a derived one. When examined, it shows design, purpose and a well ordered arrangement, the work of a vast mind of unlimited proportions. Back then of the universe there must be as its originating cause, an infinite power comprising being, mind, intelligence and will. Such a power is God, and it is significant that the name by which He was known to an ancient people, was Jahveh the eternally existing one, or the great I AM.

The universe in its vastness is an expression of a conception in the mind of God. The more it is studied, the more its divine origin and workmanship become evident. One characteristic which is the most noticeable, is that the universe is governed by law, with nothing left to chance and nothing arbitrary or accidental. Law governs all its development and growth, and all its operations. Hence there is order throughout, the planets moving each in its orbit, the earth rotating around the sun, day and night, and the four seasons in regular sequence. We find that on the conformity to laws governing the universe, its growth, development and security are dependent. Thus it is seen that OBEDIENCE TO LAW IS THE PRIMARY FUNDAMENTAL PRINCIPLE OF LIFE. This is universally true as an old theologian wrote: "Of law there can be no less acknowledged than that her seat is in the bosom of God, her voice the harmony of the world; all things in heaven and earth do her homage, the very least as feeling her care, and the greatest as not exempt from her power; both angels and men, and creatures of what condition soever, though each in different sort and manner, yet all, with one consent, admiring her as the mother of their peace and joy."

Law and order are involved in life. Thus all creatures are under law and intended to be obedient to the laws by which they are naturally governed. Four kinds of obedience can be distinguished: 1. Mechanical and automatic, like that of the heavenly bodies, and the elements; 2. Instinctive, like that of the plants and lower order of animals; 3. Instinctive but partly intelligent, like that of the higher order of animals; 4. Intelligent and free, involving knowledge, understanding, power of choice and exercise of the will, like that of personal beings, angels and men.
