Radio for Mission Field

Rt. Rev. Nathaniel Seymour Thomas D. D., Episcopal Missionary Bishop of Wyoming, presides over that wide expanse of territory where the wild bison formerly roamed and Buffalo Bill battled with the hostile Indians; and which is now given up to the sheep-herder and the cowboy. Churches and missionary stations in many cases are two and three hundred miles apart, and with the bishop's staff of missionaries so limited that not much more than a monthly service is possible, excuses for non-attendance take on a hue of sweet reasonableness. This is what Bishop Thomas proposes to change. The bishop arrived at the Church Missions House in New York, recently with an appeal for a radio outfit. "I am convinced," said he, "that through the medium of the radio we shall be able to revolutionize missionary methods in regions of magnificent distances like our state of Wyoming. Under present methods with our communicants widely scattered and mission stations few and far between, the Church finds it impossible to reach all of our people more than once a month. Radio is just the thing to remedy this situation. I will install it in the Cathedral at Laramie and make a weekly business of sending to the small, scattered missions throughout the state the full service and sermon which we have there each Sunday. With such an outfit the possibilities are, of course, unlimited as regards the section affected. It will be possible to send to our widely dispersed people then, not only the full service on Sunday, but speeches, concerts, news items, etc., throughout the week. The value of such a service to the thousands of people who are living lonely lives in our sparsely settled regions is incalculable. The Church will make a great mistake not to take immediate advantage of this new advance of science."

Bishop Thomas has laid the matter of radio service for missionaries before the Department of Missions of the Church, and it will probably be one of the live subjects brought before the Episcopal General Convention at Portland next fall.

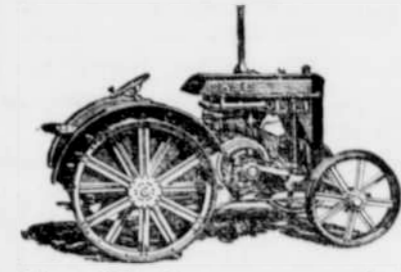
