Mr. and Mrs. S. P. Pesznecker leave today or tomorrow for Vancouver, Washington, where they will make their future home. As they have been here in Estacada and vicinity a number of years the place will seem strange without them. Both Mr. and Mrs. Pesznecker are natives of Hungary, and were married in that country, where their two oldest children, Joe and Steve, were born. In 1902 they left for the United States, settling first at Schenectady, N. Y., where for five years Mr. Pesznecker worked for the General Electric Company, as he was an expert electrician, having served a rigid and exacting apprenticeship in the old country. At Schenectady his son Leo was born. Then for three years he lived on a farm in that vicinity. He came with his family to Portland, in the fall of 1909, where he lived for two years. In 1911 he moved to a farm in Garfield, and in 1915 started the Cascade garage in the frame building on Main street, subsequently moving into the brick building built by Dr. Adix, now occupied by Wilcox Bros., to whom he sold out his business about two years ago. Since then he has worked at different occupations. He is a naturalized citizen and during the war was intensely patriotic, although his native country was among the enemies of his adopted country, investing in liberty bonds and contributing to the various drives. It is too bad that Estacada should lose such an expert mechanic, but having received a lucrative offer, he feels that he ought to accept from financial reasons. He regrets leaving his old friends and expresses his appreciation of the patronage given him while in business here.
