Sterilize Cider

It is illegal to sell cider that has not been preserved or sterilized. Cider may be preserved by using one tenth of one per cent of benzoate of soda. This method is not always successful in preventing the formation of alcohol. The safest way is to use only good sound apples for cider making. Thoroughly strain the product, place in glass or tin containers and sterilize for 30 minutes at a temperature of 160 degrees F.—O. A. C. Exp. station.
