




The agricultural bloc formed the nucleus for the opposition to the bills. No religious rancor entered into the discussion, but they were voted down primarily because they would increase expenses.

Representative Lewis' bill to prohibit the importation or transportation of wines for sacramental purposes was crushed by an overwhelming negative vote when the house indefinitely postponed it.

Party Change Regulated. A bill by Representative Kuehn to prevent changes in registration from one party to another within 30 days of a primary election, passed the house with only slight opposition. Among the eight democrats in the house only two voted against the measure and there was but a scattering of republicans in opposition to it. The house also passed the bill introduced by Representative Hesse of Washington county, doing away with all the sections of the Oregon laws which provide for the taxation of all dogs within the state.

The speed cop who brings disrepute upon his community by making arrests simply in order that his own income may be increased through getting a percentage of the fines assessed, may become a thing of the past, if the senate approves a bill passed by the house. The measure prohibits the splitting of fines or payment of fees out of fines to officers making arrests for violation of the speed laws. It covers officers of any city or county and the state itself.

> Oregon Trail Bill Passed. The first senate bill to pass the house was Senator Strayer's measure designating the east and west highway from the Pacific ocean to the Idaho line as the Oregon trail. 
