Explains How It May Be Determined.

C. G. Abbot of the Smithsonian instituannounced in an address at the Carnegle institution of Washington.

Working with the 100-inch telescope at Mount Wilson observatory this fall, Doctor Abbot measured the heat at different parts of the spectrum of ten stars and the sun. The rays were dispersed by a spectroscope in a band similar to the rainbow.

To amend an act entitled "An act to incorporate the City of Estacada, in the County of C'ackamas, State of Oregon", filed in the office of the Secretary of State January 31, as amended by the legal voters of said City at the special election held therein on August 21, 1920, and to amend all acts subsequently enacted by the Legislative Assembly or by vote of the people.

BE IT ENACTED by the People of the City of Estacada that an act entitled "An act to incorporate the City of Estacada, in the County of Clackamas, State of Oregon", filed in the office of the Secretary of State January 31, 1905, as amended by the legal voters of said City at the special election held therein on August 21, 1920, and as amended by all acts subsequently enacted by the Legislative Assembly or by vote of the people, be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto Section 44 to read as follows:

SECTION 44.

SECTION 44.

Subdivision 1. For the purpose of procuring funds for street improvement purposes in and for the City of Estacada, Clackamas County, Oregon, the Council of said City is hereby authorized and empowered to issue and dispose of general obligation bonds of said City in the sum of not to exceed \$14,000.00, said bonds to be in denominations of \$500 or \$1,000 each, to be dated at a convenient time to be fixed. dated at a convenient time to be fixed by the Council and to mature at such time or times as the Council at the time of providing for their issue may determine, but not to exceed twenty years from date of issue, said bonds to be signed by the Mayor and counter-signed by the Recorder under the corporate seal of the City, and to have attached thereto semi-annual interest coupons bearing the engraved fac-simile signatures of the Mayor and Recorder, whereby the City shall be held in substance and effect to undertake and promise to pay to the bearer of each of said bonds at maturity therein like gold coin at the rate of six per cent (6%) per annum, payable semi-annually, each of said bonds to be a direct general obligation of the City of Estacada and to be known as "City of Estacada Street Improvement Bonds", the principal of and the interest on said bonds to be payable at the Fiscal Agency of the State of Oregon in New York City.

Subdivision 2. The debt limitations contained in the charter of said City shall not apply to the bonds hereby authorized.

Subdivision 3. The Council shall each year at the time of making the annual tax levy for City purposes include in such levy a sum sufficient to pay in-terest due on the outstanding bonds of this issue and to retire the principal thereof at maturity.


