O. A. C. Attendance
Clackamas county has been represented this school year by 87 out of 3420 students registered in the institution, according to figures just issued by E. B. Lemon, registrar. Including the short course and summer session students 4727 have been registered. Men registered number 2328 and women 1092. New students total 1184 and old 2236. Collegiate courses are taken by 3228, while vocational students number 192.
The average age of both men and women is 22.73 years. The average age for freshmen is 20.07; sophomores 21.58; juniors 22.85 and seniors 24.88. Both the youngest and oldest senior comes from the engineering department. George E. Linton, 20, is the youngest, while Frank L. Grimm, 42, is the oldest.

"With sincere regret we see him depart, and with hopeful hearts we bid him God-speed."


