CONCERNING ANGELS.
 This coming Saturday, September 29, is known in the church calendar as the festival of St. Michael and All Angels; or in shortened form as Michaelmas. It is the Church's recognition of those mysterious beings who pervade the pages of the Scriptures from first to last. In many manners and shapes they appear, sometimes as ordinary men, sometimes in human semblance with the addition of wings, sometimes as wheels of fire, and sometimes in indescribable forms.

The mystery which attaches to them has proved a great attraction to the artist, some of the choicest masterpieces in painting and sculpture being inspired by them. What are they? Are they the disembodied spirits of human beings as many apparently think? By no means, for they are a distinct creation from men, long antedating the human race. The scriptures state that when the foundations of the earth were laid, all the sons of God shouted for joy. The word angels means messengers, and probably was not applied to them until there arose an order in creation to which they could act as messengers. Sons of God was therefore their original name, indicating that they were personal beings. And this is what is gathered from the Scriptures, which show also that they are rational beings endowed with free wills, immortal and of spiritual substance. While as rational and free they resemble man, they are not corporeal. Their bodies in which they appeared to human sight, were either only in semblance or else temporarily assumed. They are not part, as men are, of the material creation. They were never made flesh as Christ was at His Incarnation. Perhaps on account of this, they do not possess a common nature, forming companies, not races, nor do they marry or give in marriage.

The purpose of their origin was for a free service under God. As a preparation they had to undergo a moral probation. We are not informed as to the actual test, but the result was that some fell into condemnation, who since then have been known as the devil and his angels. The angels who proved true and faithful, are divided into various orders and ranks viz: Seraphim, Cherubim, Thrones, Dominions, Principalities, Powers, Virtues, Archangels and Angels. But however interesting their history, the main question in which we are most concerned is, "What is their relation to us?" In the epistle to the Hebrews, we are told that they are "Ministering spirits sent forth to minister to them who shall be heirs of salvation," and in the collect for Michaelmas day, we pray that "as thy holy angels always do thee service in heaven, so by thy appointment, they may succeed and defend us on earth." EFFECT OF A STRIKE.
 Owing to a pressman's strike in New York City, the papers were hard pushed to it, to get out in any form. The result was peculiar, for both the morning and evening papers issued combined editions in their separate establishments bearing imprints at their masthead, of all the different papers affected by the strike. The decrease in size was also remarkable. The New York Herald, instead of a two section 28 page edition, issued one section only of eight pages. But business otherwise was seriously interfered with, the great stores felt the loss of advertising most keenly. They tried issuing circulars, but this method proved not only vastly more expensive but much less effective. Two large railroad bond issues reported ready, were delayed, the twelve million Union Pacific and ten million Great Northern equipment trust certificates. How long will arbitrary strikes be allowed to upset the business of the country? Experience shows very clearly that the public is always the chief loser, and yet is allowed no voice in the matter.

Peach blight is likely to play havoc with Oregon orchards this fall unless growers spray their trees at once, after picking, with Bordeaux mixture 6-6-50, reports H. P. Barss, plant pathologist of the O. A. C. experiment station. Twig and bud infection is sure to develop on unprotected trees with the first rains. Blight is responsible for more damage to Oregon peach orchards than any other disease, and conditions this season favor a more serious attack than usual. Directions for preparation of Bordeaux mixture will be sent by the college on grower's request.

There were two fatalities due to industrial accidents in Oregon during the week ending September 29, according to a report prepared by the state industrial accident commission. The victims were William Quesnell, logger, Knappa, and Roy Sturns, teamster, Enterprise. A total of 710 accidents were reported during the week.

As an aftermath of the meeting of the Albany chamber of commerce and engineers who have been working on plans and estimates for the two proposed bridges over the Willamette at Harrisburg and at Albany, the issue of voting bonds to the amount of \$178,450.49 for the Linn county share in the two bridges will go on the ballot this fall.

The financial statements issued by the Astoria banks showing their condition at the close of business on September 14, shows that the amount of deposits in the five local institutions had been increased by \$609,012.26, or 3 1/2 per cent since the former statements were issued for June 30 of this year. The total amount of deposits at present is \$7,777,975.
