An increase of about 5 per cent in the enrollment for the academic year on the University of Oregon campus at Eugene is indicated by the registration to date of full-time students.

The full-time registration on the Eugene campus at noon, October 4, was 2184, only five less than the total for the entire fall term a year ago. Registrar Carleton E. Spencer predicts a total registration before fall enrollment ends of from 2225 to 2240 students, as against 2189 last fall. He expects a total enrollment at Eugene for the year—fall, winter and spring terms—of between 2500 and 2600.
