Five years ago next Sunday, Germany accepted the armistice terms of the allies. What a wave of relief swept over the country when the news was confirmed. The outlook is far from promising, and the coming winter will increase the hardships in Europe. Whether the proposed commisgion to inquire into Germany's ability to pay in the way of reparations will accomplish any good is problematical, for she is in such a position that it will be difficult to collect from her unless she is willing to pay. We believe] that she has been stalling off and playing a waiting game, for the allies to become disrupted, and thus lessen the collective pressure they could bear on her. The result would be that Germany would get off with a much reduced payment, Once this is effected some startling surprises in German financial rehabilitation will likely occur. Even now she manages to make gold payments for raw materials which are essential to her industries. And it was ascerted recently by a high financial authority that she has large gold reserves in England, the U. S. A. and elsewhere.
