Notice is hereby given to the legal voters of School District No. 108 of Clackamas County, State of Oregon, that a School Meeting of said district will be held at High School, on the 18th day of December, 1923, at 8 o'clock in the afternoon for the purpose of discussing the budget hereinafter set out with the levying board and to vote on the proposition of levying a special district tax.

The total amount of money needed by the said district during the fiscal year beginning on June, 1924, and ending June 30, 1925, is estimated in the following budget and includes the amounts to be received from the county school fund, state school fund, elementary school fund, special district tax, and all other moneys of the district:

Notice of School Election to Increase Tax More Than Six Per Cent Over That of the Previous Year.

NOTICE is hereby given to the legal voters of School District No. 108 of Clackamas County, State of Oregon, that an election will be held in said District at High School on the 18th day of December, 1923, at eight o'clock in the afternoon, to vote on the question of increasing the amount of the tax levy in said District for the school year 1924-25 by more than six per cent over the amount of such levy for the year immediately preceding.

It is necessary to raise this additional amount by special levy for the following reasons: Material, supplies and labor are approximately 25% higher than heretofore; the state department has recommended an additional teacher in the High School in order to standardize the school, and the district faces a deficit for the present school year of approximately \$2657.00.
