### FARM REMINDERS

O. A. C. EXP. STATION

Two yegetable crops a season and use of cover crops to maintain soils in physical and fertility conditions, are advantages of irrigating the vegetable garden. Quality and size are improved by water at the right time. It will enable the growing of one crop at least not in competition with general growers, insuring a good market. Irrigation crops hit the market both earlier and later than unwatered crops.

Egg shape and size are inherited. Gradual selection of those birds which in addition to a large number also lay "selects" will in time eliminate the birds laying the lower grade eggs.

Three types of insect and disease pest remedies are often hawked about Oregon farms endangering real control. One type of these fake panaceas is merely harmless, having power neither for good nor bad, one is actually dangerous to the crops it is said to protect, and the third is largely ineffective because the remedy is not in suitable form for the designed use, and is high priced.


