Denby's Successor

The nomination of Chief Justice Curtis D. Wilbur of the California Supreme court to the Secretary of the Navy, succeeding Edwin Denby, who resigned, has met with approval on all sides. Wilbur is a native of Boonesville, Iowa, having been born there on may 10, 1867. He graduated from the United States Naval Academy in 1888, afterwards entering the law. his first entrance into public life was as chief deputy district attorney of Los Angeles, serving in that capacity for four years. He was then elected Superior Judge, holding that office until 1918, when he was elected Associate Justice of the California Supreme Court, entering that body in 1919 for a twelve year term. Last year he was elevated to the chief justiceship. Despite the fact that he forsook the navy for the law he has always maintained a keen interest in naval affairs, more especially the mechanical side, and has ever been a keen student of the progress made in battleships during the past decade or so. In California they say that his very industriousness causes others to work while engaged upon any task with him.

Mr. Wilbur is a man of deep religious feelings. He does not smoke or drink and for a number of years wrote what might be called a weekly sermon for the Los Angeles papers. He is a man who stands for those institutions on which this conutry is founded. He believes in church life and the sancity of the home.
