OBITUARY

John H. Walker, who lived in the Garfield country for the past two years on a homestead, passed away very suddenly on August 31st as the result of a stroke of paralysis. No one seems to know much about him. The writer was told by a man who was befriended by Mr. Walker some four or five years ago, that the deceased was born in Gilliam county, Missouri, on the 22nd of February, 1845. His parents died when he was ten years old, leaving him and a sister alone in the world. The sister went to Texas, while the boy went to the Erie canal, where he worked for some years. Then he became a sailor on the Great Lakes where he sailed the unsalted seas for many years. He also spent some years in Chicago, finally drifting west to Portland, where he was living from five to seven years ago. Two years ago he took up a homestead on which he lived until his death last Sunday morning. He was known to a good many of the people of the Garfield neighborhood. Everyone had a good word for him.

He was buried from the Christian church in Estacada, on Tuesday, morning, September 2nd, 1924, the Rev. B. F. Clay conducting the services, and was interred in the Odd Fellows' cemetery under the direction of Joseph E. Gates.
