The Clackamas county fair proved to be one of the most successful in its history: The live stock and poultry exhibits were never surpassed in former years. The vegetable and grain exhibits were also up to standard in spite of the long exceptional drouth which has prevailed this season. On Friday the attendance broke the record, as more than 6000 passed through the gates. On the second day rain affected the attendance somewhat.

PORTLAND—LaFollette's record and the platform are such as to appeal strongly to the farmer, Manager Kroner declares.

LaFollette opposed the Esch-Cummins law and now favors its repeal. That law guaranteed to the railroads approximately six per cent on investment and billions of watered stock. The increased freight rates pyramided costs and thus taxed the farmers out of billions of dollars both in lowering prices of their products

and increases of commodities they had to purchase.

Senators LaFollette and Wheeler are leaders in the movement to change the financial system that permits of a disastrous deflation movement such as impoverished so many farmers in 1920 and 1921. The farmers were the chief sufferers by this financial manipulation, and there is no guaranty that there will not be a repetition so long as the finances of the nation are given into the hands of a score of wealthy men in the United States.
