#### CITIZENS AWAY FROM HOME MAY CAST VOTE

The republican state central committee states that Oregonians away from home may vote, for there is a provision in the election law permitting this practice, and no one may lose his vote on Nov. 4, on this account.

Anyone who expects to be away from home on election day should provide himself with a certificate of registration that may be obtained from the clerk of his county. By presenting this certificate he will be entitled to vote in any county of the state for state and national tickets.

In case the absent voter has not obtained a certificate, it will be required that he swear in his vote. This can be done in Multnomah county by six freeholders, but in all other parts of the state, two freeholders may make affidavit.
