Chevrolet Motor Company

Detroit, Nov.—The Chevrolet Motor company this last week celebrated its 13th anniversary. The company was founded on November 3, 1911.

From that date to November 3, this year the company has produced nearly a million and three quarters vehicles, with one exception the greatest production record in the motor car industry in this period. To be exact, there have been produced 1,744,870 Chevrolet motor cars and light delivery trucks.

It is in the last three years, however, that Chevrolet has had such phenomenal growth. More than 1,000,000 Chevrolets have been produced since January 1, 1922 to November 3, 1924—a 34 month's period.

It was on November 3, 1911 that the Chevrolet Motor Company was organized.

Chevrolet today occupies 167 buildings with a total floor space of 6,555,227 square feet, and 345 acres are covered by the Chevrolet plants. The dollar and cents volume of this company's business in 1923 was \$229,819,867. There are 12 Chevrolet plants located in the following cities: Detroit, Michigan; Flint, Michigan; Toledo, Ohio; Bay City, Michigan; Buffalo, N. Y.; Tarrytown, N. Y.; Cincinnati, Ohio; St. Louis, Mo.; Janesville, Wis; consin, and Oakland, California.
