**WILL BUILD LINEN MILL AT SALEM**

Salem is to have a linen mill established there in the near future. The plans are to have the machinery installed and ready for operation the first of July, 1925. The company plans to manufacture Salmon twine, barness thread and shoe thread. The total outlay will be about \$150,000, and this mill will be the first of its kind to be established west of the Mississippi. The flax contracted for next year will reach about three thousand acres. Most of the stockholders are residents of Salem and Marion county.
