The Eagle Creek Missionary Society met at the home of Mrs. Walter Glover, Wednesday, March 18.

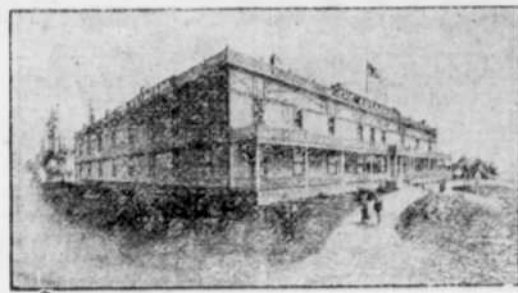
