3. -Making Camp-Before build ing a fire scrape away all inflam ble material from a spot 5 feet in diameter. Dig a hole in the center and in it build your camp fire. Keep your fire small. Never build it against trees or logs or near brush.

4. Breaking Camp-Never break camp until your fire is out-dead

5. Brush Burning-Never burn slash or brush in windy weather or while there is the slightest danger the fire will get away. 6. How to Put Out a Camp

Fire-Stir the coals while soaking them with water. Turn small sticks and drench them both sides. Wet the ground around the fire. If you can't get water stir in dirt and tread it down until


