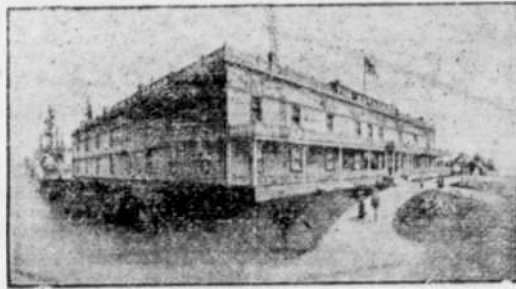

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a special election will be held on the 29th day of May, 1925, at which there will be submitted to the electors of the City of Estacada, and to the electors of the hereinafter described territory, the question of altering and extending the boundaries of said city so as to annex and include within the boundaries of the City of Estacada the following described territory, to wit:

Beginning at the Southeast corner of the William M. Wade and wife Donation Land Claim No. 39 in Township 3 South, Range 4 East of the Willamette Meridian, running thence North tracing the East line of said Wade Donation Land Claim to the Northeast corner of the Wilbur M. Wade tract of land as described in Vol. 159 page 281 deeds records of Clackamas County Oregon, thence Westerly tracing the Northernly line of the said Wilbur M. Wade tract and the Amy L. Ely tract to the center of the County Road, known as the Currinsville and Estacada County Road; thence Northernly tracing the center of said County Road to the Northeast corner of land described in Vol. 135 page 464 deed records of Clackamas County, Oregon; thence Westerly tracing the Northernly line thereof to the most West-ly corner of land described in Vol. 116 page 181 deed records of Clackamas County, Oregon; thence Northernly tracing the Easterly line of land described Vol. 164 page 35 deed records of Clackamas County, Oregon, to the Northeast corner thereof; thence Westerly tracing the Northernly line of land described in said Vol. 164 page 35 to the center of the Right-of-way of the Portland Electric Power Company; thence Northernly tracing the center line of the said right-of-way to the Northeast corner of that certain tract of land described Vol. 151 page 564 deed records of Clackamas County, Oregon; thence Westerly tracing the Northernly line of said tract described Vol. 151 page 564 to the Northwesterly corner thereof; thence Northernly tracing the Westerly line of the Kenney tract as described Vol. 143 page 395 deed records of Clackamas County, Oregon, to its intersection with the North line of Section 20, Township 3 South, Range 4 East of the Willamette Meridian; thence West tracing the North line of said Section 20 to the Northwest corner thereof; thence South tracing the west line of said Section 20 to its intersection with the South or Southerly bank of the Clackamas River; thence up said River tracing the Southerly and Westerly bank of said River to a point due South of the most Westerly Southwest corner of the Franklin Pierce Donation Land Claim No. 38, Township 3 South, Range 4 East of the Willamette Meridian; thence North to the boundary line of the City of Estacada, Clackamas County, Oregon.

The polls for the receipt of ballots at the aforesaid places and on said date will be opened for the receipt of ballots at the hour of 8 o'clock A. M. and closed at 8 o'clock P. M.

Electors residing within the City of Estacada and within the territory above described are invited to vote upon such proposition of annexation by placing upon their ballots the words "For Annexation" or "Against Annexation."

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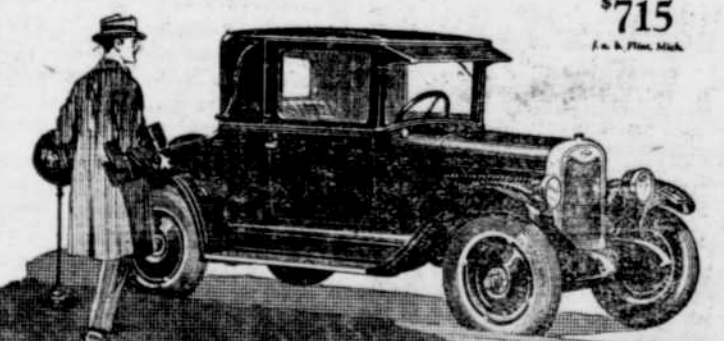
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
