SUSPENSION OF LICENSES OF MOTOR VEHICLES

From Oregon Motor Vehicle Laws, 1924.

Considerable discussion has been heard in this community recently concerning the suspension of driver's licenses, to aid in clearing up some of the difficulties we quote the following from the "Oregon Motor Vehicle Laws" compiled by Sam A. Kozier, 1924.

SECTION 24—Suspension of License. "The secretary of state may suspend any operator's or chauffeur's license issued under the provisions of this act upon a request or recommendation of a magistrate, sheriff or chief of police or city or town marshal or any other peace officer charged with the enforcement of highway or Motor Vehicle laws of the State of Oregon, for any cause which he may deem sufficient * * *"

FORMER ESTACADA STUDENT GRADUATES WITH HONORS
