OREGON NEWS ITEMS OF SPECIAL INTEREST

Brief Resume of Happenings of the Week Collected for Our Readers.

Cottage Grove is to have free mail delivery after October 1.

Miss Vera Bruner, 16, of Woodburn, was drowned while bathing at Ocean Park, Wash.

Building permits issued in Baker call for new construction valued at close to \$300,000.

Plans are now under way for Roseburg's second annual home and land products show, September 24, 25 and 26.

The barn on the farm of W. A. Muller, near Shedd, was burned to the ground with its contents, 30 tons of hay.

The attendance at the fifth annual camp meeting of the Oregon Methodist conference in Cottage Grove reached 1500.

Harney county is planning a roundup, to be staged September 10, 11 and 12, at Burns, at which \$6000 will be given in prizes.

Beauty specialists hereafter must have licenses to practice in this state, the law passed by the last legislature being now effective.

Silverton will stage her second annual Community fair again this year on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, September 10, 11 and 12.

Survey of the route of the proposed extension of the Oregon trunk line south from Bend to Klamath Falls will be completed this week.

Portland business men have been invited by the Ashland Chamber of Commerce to visit the Rogue River valley to inspect the wonderful pear crop.

If city expenditures continue for the rest of the year as they have for the first six months, Eugene will be \$60,000 "in the red," the auditor's report shows.

Property valued at \$90,000 has been purchased by the Oregon Trunk railroad on the west bank of Link river in Klamath Falls, and will be used as a passenger station.

The Rev. H. C. Stover, who has been pastor of the Freewater Federated church four years, has resigned to accept a similar position with the First Congregational church of Salem.

The plant of the Cherry City Milling company of Salem, which burned recently with a loss estimated at \$120,000, will not be rebuilt. This was announced by directors of the corporation.

Klamath county's grain crop this year will yield close to 1,000,000 bushels, according to estimates of farmers and others who have made a survey of farm conditions during recent weeks.

Recent assays of the ore from the Silver Jones claim in the Greenhorn district show \$54 in gold and \$1776.87 in silver to the ton. The sample was taken from a six-inch vein in a ledge 72 feet wide.

F. M. Gilliam of Fossil is six months older than the Idaho woman who recently was acclaimed as the oldest living native Oregonian. He was born March 7, 1847, at the old Mission farm below Salem.

William H. Miller, twice elected mayor of Gold Hill, and the most widely discussed mayor in the state over the Gold Hill speed cop question, has tendered his resignation and will remove to Salem.

Salem officials are in a quandary as to how to provide food and necessities for persons sentenced to terms in the city jail. The appropriation is exhausted and the city has no legal authority to issue warrants.

E. L. Elliott, who was named district attorney of Klamath county, was indicted on a charge of malfeasance in office while prohibition commissioner last year in a secret indictment returned by the grand jury.

Rhea Luper, state engineer, has signed a contract entered into between the state and the United States geological survey for completion of the topographic survey of the Bend quadrangle. The expense will be \$5000.

State agents in various counties are reporting many abandoned stills, according to William S. Levens, state prohibition commissioner, who believes that the penitentiary sentences have done much to discourage the small still owners.

The state highway commission announces that construction work on the Pacific highway just north of Oakland, Douglas county, makes it necessary that the highway be closed to traffic from 7:30 a. m. to 5:30 p. m. for about three weeks.

F. A. Rasch, for the past 12 years employed as examiner by the Oregon public service commission, has resigned to accept a position as senior examiner for the interstate commerce commission. He will make his headquarters in Washington.

E W
S

symbolizing that the contents of the sheet were drawn from all quarters of the world and spread thereto. When the design was dropped the four letters were carried in the form of "news."—Ohio State Journal.

High-Handed Action

The name "Pride's Purge" was given to an act of Col. Thomas Pride, who with a body of soldiers "purged" the Long parliament of its Presbyterian members on December 6, 1648, on which occasion 41 members were arrested and 100 were excluded on the following day. The house of commons, now reduced to about eighty independents, appointed a commission to try Charles I on a charge of treason.—Kansas City Star.

Anne de Rohan

Anne de Rohan, the daughter of Catherine de Parthenay, heiress to the house of Soubise, was born in 1562 and acquired, like her mother, a high reputation in the literary world. She would have been one of the greatest poetesses of her age, but her devoted piety turned her talent into another channel. She died, unmarried, in 1640. She was a Protestant and was celebrated for her courage as well as her learning.—Chicago Journal.
