**AUTO LIGHT LAW**

State of Oregon, Office of the Secretary of State  
Salem, August 13—Apparently some confusion has arisen as to whether or not motor vehicles operated during daylight hours only must be equipped with headlight devices in conformity with the provisions of Chapter 325, General Laws of Oregon 1925, as follows:

"Every motor vehicle, except motorcycles, operated or driven upon the public highways of this state shall exhibit during the period from one-half hour after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise, and at times when fog or other atmospheric conditions render the operations of said motor vehicles dangerous to traffic or the use of the highways, two headlamps of approximately equal candle power, not in excess of twenty one candle power."

Numerous inquiries have come to the Department relative to magneto lighting equipment. It is a well established fact that this type of equipment cannot produce the constant candle power necessary to meet the specified maximums and minimums of the main lights required by law nor can the required results be obtained with the lights in the dimmed position.

A logical interpretation of the law would imply that motor vehicles now equipped with magneto as the source of light must be changed to either battery or acetylene as provided by such law. Adjusters cannot adjust motor vehicles equipped with magneto light and issue receipts therefor, unless the equipment of the particular vehicle submitted for adjustment is changed to meet the requirements of the law.—Sam A. Kozler, Sec. State.

**GENERAL MOTORS DENIES NEW TYPE AUTO AND FUEL**

Detroit, Aug. 7.—(AP)—Reports of the discovery of a new automobile fuel that would revolutionize the motor car industry today were characterized as ridiculous by A. P. Sloane, Jr., president of the General Motors Corp. Mr. Sloane took cognizance of reports published on the strength of a statement reputed to have been made before the annual convention of the American Chemical society at Los Angeles.

"My attention has been called to recent statements in the public press relative to revolutionary inventions in the way of a type of automobile for new motor fuel or something else new and radical.

"These reports are ridiculous on their face for General Motors has recently announced new series of cars which should be a sufficient answer. In addition to this there is absolutely nothing to form even the slightest foundation for such a statement.
