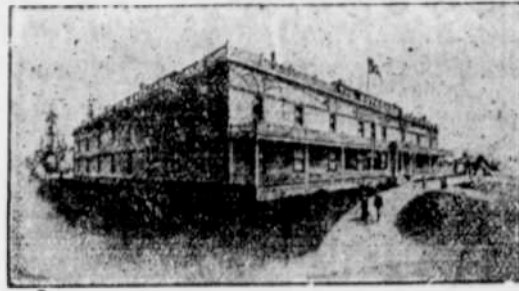
C. L. Myers of Portland, representing the Union Central Life Insurance company, was in Estacada last Tuesday.

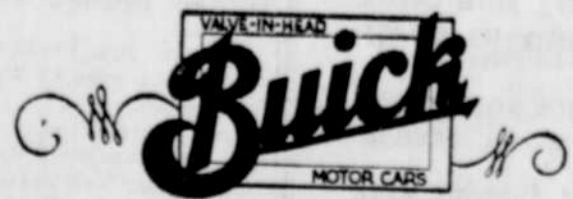
